### Town Updates

Leaf and limb pickup is starting October 1st. Leaf pickup will be weekly until November 30th. They will go around town continually to pick them up, but they must be piled at the curbside (NOT on the streets please).

Limb pickup happens on Mondays, starting October 4th, and there are specific rules to this: no limbs longer than 6' or wider than 2" in diameter. They must also be taken out to the curbside and placed for removal. If there is an rubbish in either leaf or limb pile, they will not pick up your, so take care to follow these rules.

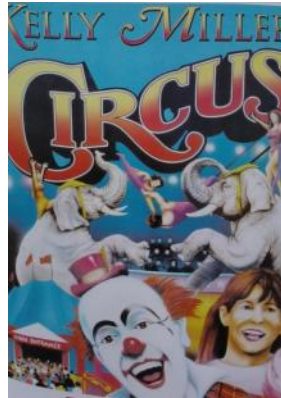
## Lion's Club Circus

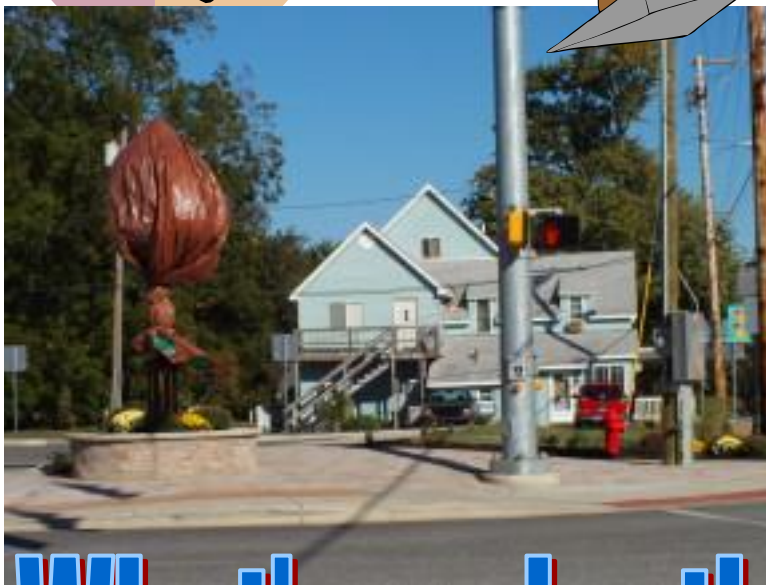
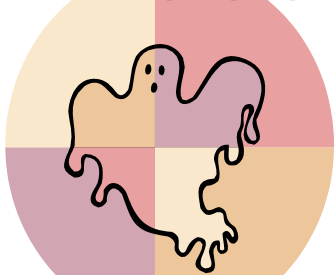

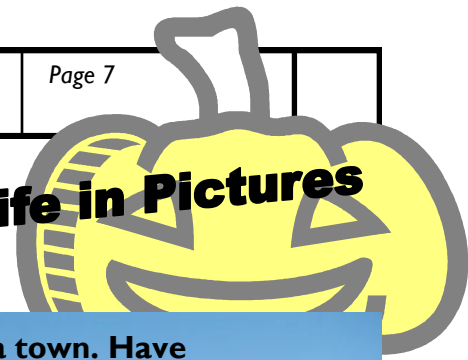
