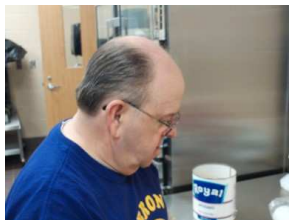
Hebron Lion's Club Pancake and Sausage Breakfast with Santa

- We will continue picking up downed branches from the ice storm, but only for a short time. By the rules, only branches 4" in diameter or less, 6' long or less and placed out by the street will be picked up. We will not pick up brush or trees that have been deliberately cut down, just storm damage. That yard waste can be taken to the Sewer Plant Monday and Friday from 8:30 to 3:30 and Saturday from 8 to noon to be dropped off.

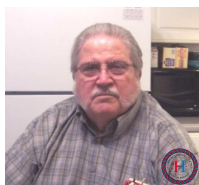
Interesting Happenings
